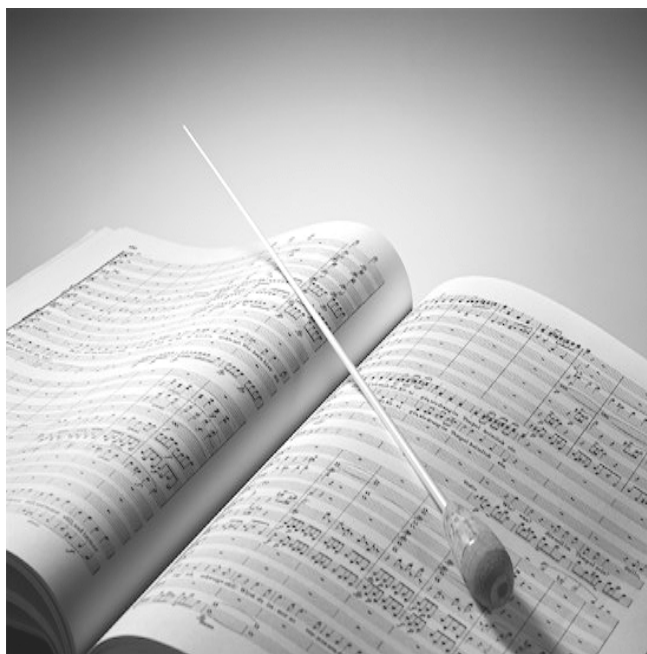

ABOUT THE CONDUCTOR

Andrea Ramsey is a Ph.D student in choral music education and University Distinguished Fellowship recipient at Michigan State University where she has assisted with the Women's Chamber Ensemble under the direction of Dr. Sandra Snow and conducts the MSU Chamber Choir. She holds a Bachelor of Arts degree in Music Education from Arkansas Tech University and a Masters of Music in Choral Conducting from the University of Kansas where she served as a graduate teaching assistant and conductor of the KU Men's Glee Club- a traditional collegiate male chorus established in 1890. Additionally, she has served as assistant director and continues to serve as composer-in-residence to the Allegro Community Children's Choir of the Kansas City metro area--an upbeat, energetic youth choral program serving over 160 singers in four ensembles, grades 3-12. She has traveled in residency with Allegro con Brio on tours to Austria and the Czech Republic (2008), and Italy (2011). A native Arkansan, Andrea has eleven years of teaching experience with children's, public school and university choruses. Her choral program in the Bentonville Public School district in Northwest Arkansas at Washington Junior High School grew to include approximately 375 students in grades 7-8. The choirs were twice invited to perform for the Arkansas All-State Music Conference. A regularly-commissioned and ASCAP award-winning composer, her works are published with Boosey & Hawkes, Hal Leonard, Colla Voce, Alliance, Santa Barbara, Pavane, Carl Fischer, and BriLee music. Andrea also enjoys work as a guest conductor and presenter.

ABOUT THE ACCOMPANIST

Karen Kaibel has Master's degrees in Vocal Performance and Music Education from Truman State University in Kirksville, Missouri. Mrs. Kaibel is a Vocal Music Teacher at Parkway Southwest Middle School. Her teaching credentials also include co-directing Chorale with St. Louis Children's Choirs, Opera Theatre of Saint Louis Summer Camp, and private voice and piano lessons. Mrs. Kaibel enjoys performing regularly as a member of the Bach Society of Saint Louis.

ABOUT THE CONDUCTOR

Dr. Robert Gillespie, Professor of Music, is responsible for string teacher training at The Ohio State University, which has one of the largest and most extensive string pedagogy degree programs in the nation. His graduating students teach in school systems and universities throughout the country.

Dr. Gillespie is a past national President of the American String Teachers Association. He is a frequent guest conductor of all-state, regional, and festival orchestras throughout the country and Europe, and he has presented string teacher sessions, workshops, and conducted concerts at national and state music educator conferences in forty-four states and Canada. His string education articles appear frequently in all the major music journals. He is co-author of the Hal Leonard string method book series, Essential Elements for Strings, Essential Elements 2000 for Strings, which has sold over four million copies to date, and Getting Started: Strolling Strings for MENC. He is also co-author of the new Oxford University Press book: Strategies for Teaching Strings: Building A Successful School Orchestra Program. ABOUT THE CONDUCTOR

Born and raised in Tuscaloosa, Alabama, Mr. Irby began playing music at the age of 12, almost immediately recognizing that it was his life's calling. Upon graduating high school, during which he had the opportunity to play and record with gospel immortal James Cleveland, Mr. Irby attended Clark Atlanta University and graduated with a B.A. in Music Education. He joined Atlanta-based piano legend Johnny O'Neal's quintet in 1991. After moving to New York in 1994, he quickly connected with the fertile and vital scene at Smalls, where he was a regular until 1997. Here he caught the attention of Blue Note Records, for which he recorded his first two albums, Full Circle and Big Mama's Biscuits, released in 1996 and 1998 respectively. During the Smalls period he also toured the U.S. and the Caribbean with the Boys Choir of Harlem in 1995; was a member of the Jazz at Lincoln Center Orchestra from 1995 to 1997; recorded and toured with Marcus Roberts and participated in the incomparable Betty Carter's Jazz Ahead Program during those same years; and began his four year stint with Roy Hargrove in 1997. Recognizing the shift in economics of the record industry, Sherman left Blue Note to form Black Warrior Records, releasing Black Warrior, Faith, and Organ Starter. Departing from Roy Hargrove's ensemble around the same time, Sherman shifted his primary focus to his own group. Although this is his primary commitment, Irby took the opportunity to join the final ensemble of the peerless Elvin Jones in 2004, and after Elvin's passing, joined Papo Va'zquez's Pirates Troubadours. Currently, he has rejoined the Jazz at Lincoln Center Orchestra and continues to perform with his quartet and his newly formed group, Organomics.

As a trombonist he is presently a member of the St. Louis Wind Symphony and the St. Louis Low Brass Collective and a former member of the Gateway City Big Band, Meramec Monday Night Jazz Band and the Mid Rivers Brass Quintet. Additional professional responsibilities include the Missouri Chairman of the National Band Association and the 2010 Missouri Music Educators College/University Vice President.

Mr. Brandes was honored 1998 with the Merit Award in Music Education from St. Louis Metro Music Educators Association and in 2000 St. Louis Metro recognized Brandes as an Outstanding Music Educator. Under his direction, the Boulder Concert Band performed at the 1998 CMEA Convention in Colorado Springs, Colorado. In 2001, Dr. Caneva was elected to membership in the American Bandmasters Association. He is currently the North Central Division Chair of the National Band Association, and the Indiana State Chair of the College Band Director's National Association. He has held offices in the Big 12 Band Director's Association and is a past member of the Board of Directors of the Colorado Music Educators Association. Other honorary and professional affiliations include the Music Educators National Conference, Indiana Bandmasters Association, Phi Kappa Phi, Pi Kappa Lambda, Phi Mu Alpha (honorary) and Kappa Kappa Psi (honorary). 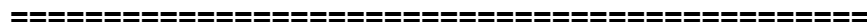
